recover from stressful events extremely fast, being socially dominant and persuasive) be advantageous – and when can it lead to exploitative behaviors? How can it play out in a work setting and what are the consequences? **Research**: How can traits of "boldness" (and other psychopathic traits) best be investigated? What types of studies are needed to move the field forward?



Scott Lilienfeld, professor, Department of Psychology, Emory University, USA. Professor Lilienfeld's main research interests concern assessments of personality disorders (with a particular focus on psychopathy), psychiatric classification and diagnosis, philosophy of science, pseudoscience and scientific thinking. Professor Lilienfeld has published extensively on

psychopathy and he has formulated a self-report measure (the Psychopathic Personality Inventory-Revised [PPI-R]) for the assessment of psychopathic traits in both criminal and non-criminal groups.

This symposium is organized by professor Clara Hellner Gumpert's research group, the Centre for Psychiatry Research (CPF), Karolinska Institutet. We have several ongoing projects about psychopathy, in community and clinical settings (see link: http://ki.se/en/cns/clara-gumperts-research-group).
